GOSPEL – Matthew 14, 22-33

"Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go ahead of him to the other side, while he sent the people away. After saying goodbye, he went up the mountain alone to pray; at sunset he was alone there. The boat was already many stadia away from land, tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. And in the fourth watch of the night he came toward them, walking on the sea. The disciples, seeing him walking on the sea, were disturbed and said: "It is a ghost," and they began to shout out of fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them saying, "Cheer up! It's me; do not fear. Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to go to you on the water." "Come!" he told her. Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water, going towards Jesus. But, seeing the violence of the wind, he was afraid and, as he began to sink, he cried out: "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus, stretching out his hand, grabbed him and said to him: "Man of little faith, why did you doubt?" They got into the boat and the wind died down. And those who were in the boat prostrated themselves before him saying: "Truly you are the Son of God."

We deepen the gospel

This episode takes place after the event of the multiplication of the loaves. The disciples have just picked up the twelve baskets of what was left, after the crowd had eaten their fill. And Matthew tells us that Jesus forced them to leave the place quickly. You can ask why; maybe there are two reasons to act like this: the first reason is the urgency of the mission. Right! But there may be something more serious. Matthew, in the episode of the temptation, (Mt 4, 1-11), tells us that Jesus had to resist the temptation of success, when the Tempter suggested that he change the stones into bread to calm his own hunger. But, this time, temptation loomed on the horizon: There, on the edge of the lake, after the impressive miracle of loaves to feed a crowd awesome, may be jesus he was afraid of giving in to the spectacular for himself and for his disciples.

Whatever it is, let's see what happens in the boat: "Tossed about by the waves, because the wind was against them." Then that voice is heard as familiar and inimitable as any friendly voice. And the voice said: "Trust! It's me; Do not be afraid!" Words already heard other times. Words that appease Once the fear ceases, Peter jumps into the water: "Lord, if it is you, order me to come to you walking on the waters." To which Jesus responds simply: "Come" And Pedro, incredible as it may seem, knew how to walk on water! Why did you look elsewhere?

Let's save the lesson, let's not look elsewhere. Peter had the only good reflex, he called Jesus and asked him for help: "Lord, save me!" "Quickly Jesus reached out his hand and seized him" and Peter found himself safe. But Jesus continues: "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Finally, Jesus and Peter got into the boat and the wind died down and they all prostrated themselves before Jesus. In the voice of Jesus and in their gestures, they had just recognized the one who brings peace to the world. "Truly, you are the Son of God!" There will still be in the lives of the disciples and in ours, other impulses, other denials, but it will suffice to say humbly "Lord, save me!" so that we may find his outstretched hand.
