### **GOSPEL. Mark 1, 21b-28**

“Jesus entered Capernaum, and when the Sabbath came, Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. Everyone was amazed at his teaching, because he taught them as one who had authority and not as the scribes. And there was a man in the synagogue possessed by an unclean spirit, who began to shout: “What do you want from us, Jesus of the Nazarene? Have you come to destroy us? I already know who you are: the Holy One of God.” But Jesus rebuked him, saying, “Shut up and get out of this man.” The impure spirit shook him violently and, with a loud scream, came out of that man. Everyone was amazed and asked one another: “What is this? Teach in a new way, full of authority; He gives orders to the impure spirits, and they obey him!” And his fame spread quickly everywhere, throughout the whole region of Galilee.”

**To internalize the text (*Marie-Noëlle THABUT*)**

The book of Deuteronomy reminds us today of an old episode from Sinai in the time of Moses. The people gathered at the foot of the mountain had heard the voice of God speaking to Moses and their hearts were divided between admiration and fear: admiration because it was unprecedented that God himself addressed those poor people; but also fear because could the voice of God be heard without dying? After the insistence of the first reading on the importance of listening to the true word of God transmitted by the prophets, it is not surprising to hear, as an echo of it, Psalm 94(95): “Today will you listen to his word?” Because the people of Israel had not always listened docilely to their prophets, even in the desert when there was much reluctance to what Moses proposed. And this psalm, precisely, is totally impregnated with a very negative experience of what happened in the desert.

"Be with and for the Lord without divisions", decidedly. This is the only thing important to Paul. We must keep in memory the beautiful

formula that we read last Sunday "Time is limited", literally "time has loaded its sails" like a ship arriving at port. Christ came to fulfil God's desire, "to gather us all in Him."

Mark apparently wanted to focus the reader's interest on the teachings of Jesus, since, in today's story, the words "teach" and "teaching" occur four times in a few lines. That's right, at the beginning of the text "Jesus went to the Synagogue, and there, he taught." Everyone was amazed because of his teaching because he taught as someone who has authority and not like the scribes. "Everyone was wondering: What does this mean? Here is a new teaching, proclaimed with authority! It could be that, among those present, some thought of God's promise to Moses: "I will bring out from among his brothers a prophet like you and put my words into his mouth." (Dt 18:18) It is therefore at the heart of this teaching of Jesus that Mark notices a rupture, a novelty: the history of the world has just changed; the teaching of the scribes has just been replaced by the teaching of the Saviour. And, proof is quickly given, because Mark does not tell us what Jesus has said but rather, between those two instances of this "newbie's" amazing teaching, Mark describes the casting out of a "demon," what we would call today an "exorcism" Which means that, for Mark, the two facets of Jesus' teaching, teaching and exorcism (healing), go together. In other words: that the best of teachings is action, the true one that frees man from all types of evil.

### **Tips for prayer**

- "He taught them as someone who had authority", what do these words mean to you?
- What do you need to be freed from?
- Teaching and healing go together in Jesus. What does our world, your community, your group need to know to be liberated?
